


We continue to explore how followers of Jesus receive life in his name as Jesus lives his final days on earth.

They specifically deliver ethnically diverse bags of food which are chosen by their families. They deliver these bags weekly to 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade students at the Worthington Intermediate School. These bags contain 4-5 pounds of nutritious, non-perishable food including a variety of fruits, vegetables, proteins, grains, and soups/entrees. Thank

Donations will be dedicated to ALC's support of the Every Meal program served weekly at the Intermediate School.



#### Mission Quilts

"Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God." Isaiah 40:1

Imagine the comfort and care you feel when you snuggle under a comforter or wear a piece of clothing made or wom by a loved one. That's the feeling that is shared through a Lutheran World Relief Quilt! In a simple combination of fabric and thread, our faithful quilters here at ALC reach out to people in their time of need with a strong message of hope -"you are not alone." First and foremost, recipients use their LWR Quilts to shield against the cold and rain, and for warm bedding. But their versatility also makes guilts useful as simple tents, floor coverings, or a wrap to hold a baby on a mother's back. Many of the materials used by our quilters are donated. Following specific guidelines and dimensions suggested by LWR, practical and washable fabrics are pieced and sewn together and tied, with a backing and filler in between. Consistency in size is important for fairness as well as shipping. Our quilters gather together at ALC weekly on Wednesdays at 9:00 a.m., with a goal of making 6 quilts each week! What an awesome ministry! Any one is welcome to join them, from cutting to sewing to tying, there are a variety of ways


