Congregational Vitality Survey Update

On Thursday, May 18 at 6:00pm, Pr. Troy Pfibsen, SWMN Synod Director of Evangelical Mission, will meet with the Church Council to learn about and reflect on the survey results. 133 people took the survey. Roughly two thirds of the surveys were taken on-line compared to one third that were completed using the paper copy. We at ALC are the first congregation in the SWMN Synod to take this updated survey. Pr. Pfibsen is learning along with us. One of the decision for the council is to decide how to share the survey results with members of the congregation. Council Action: Full-Time Youth Director Sought

On Thursday, April 20 at the regular monthly meeting, ALC's church council, after discussion and reflection, made the motion to call a full-time Youth Ministry Director. This vote was unanimous for this action to move forward.

Pr. Anne and Pr. Jeremy were charged by the council to make this announcement on Sunday, April 23 during both worship services. The pastors were urged to "tell the stories you've shared with us these last months to the congregation."

Pr. Jeremy will be the primary lead for this process working in connection with Kristin Appel and Personnel Ministry Team chair, Bob Demuth. Pr. Anne will provide administrative support and overall guidance to align this new position with the emerging strategic plan that is being developed.

There is \$25,000 allotted in the 2023 congregational budget for this position. Additional funding for the 2023 program year will need to be raised to support this position. Questions, ideas, and concerns can be directed to the pastors and council members. Prayers are encourage to nurture the growing seeds of this ministry.

What happened to the sound?

This article explores how you can receive the best audio or sound of an ALC worship service via live-stream and occasionally in a recording. It was written by Sylvia Andersen, who has spent time listening to our worship services on a variety of different devices. There is helpful wisdom written below.

Occasionally our on-line congregation gives us feedback that there were parts of the service they couldn't hear. While most technological issues are beyond our control, I can give you a couple of tips.

- ⇒ Try using a different device for viewing. Each TV, computer, tablet and phone has different components installed for viewing and listening. So sometimes it is as simple a fix as using a different device. We have done some experiments of our own. We viewed the same service on three different devices and the results were varied. When we watched on the computer, we couldn't hear any sound if the lectern microphone was in use but all the other microphones were fine. We viewed the same service on our tablet (Kindle or iPad) and all of the microphones were acceptable. Then, we viewed the service on our phone and the sound quality was far superior no matter who was speaking or which microphone was in use.
- ⇒ If you are watching the livestream and experiencing sound or visual issues, it might be that the internet speed is unstable. In that case, watching the recording of the service that is available later might help.

We, the Technology Ministry Team and South Booth Technicians, are doing our best to make sure that we are providing the best possible quality on-line experience as you worship with us. We appreciate constructive feedback and will respond as soon as possible. Even though we have been using technology to support the sharing of worship services for a while, each time we broadcast live-stream it is a new day.

ALC is blest with gifted technology-minded people and financial resources to support this ministry.

Ways to Experience Worship

One of the primary reasons for the new edition was the need for accessibility for worshipers and participants in ministry events.

There are three distinct ways you worshippers can fully participate in worship. Ushers can help you with each one:

- 1. Hearing Assistance: There are devices that can support hearing of in-person worship services.
- 2. Visual Assistance: There are paper copies of the bulletin for each worship service that contains all the spoken and sung words for worship in larger print.
- 3. **Mobility** Assistance: Valet parking is available. In addition, communion servers are comfortable and will serve you the Lord's Supper in the chair where you worship.
