#### November 19: "With Glad & Generous Hearts" Stewardship

**Stewardship Devotional Booklet,** Available on November 1 in the Church Office and on November 5 at the Welcome Center, the ALC Stewardship Devotion Booklet contains scripture stories and reflections to support the theme "Day by Day, they Broke Bread Together with Glad and Generous Hearts."

**Stewardship Sourdough Bread Baking Class,** Pastor Anne will be leading a Sourdough Bread baking workshop for 10-12 participants. On Friday, November 17 at 6:00 learn the first stages of this no-knead bread. On Saturday, November 18 at 9am, prepare your bread for baking and learn how to care for your starter and receive recipes.

**Stewardship Commitment Sunday** is Sunday, November 19 at both worship services. You will be invited to bring forward your 2024 Financial Commitment card to the Altar for a blessing. Between worship services, a Stewardship Brunch celebrating the glad and generous people of ALC will be served and hosted by the Stewardship Ministry Team. The menu is Egg Bake and homemade Cinnamon Rolls.

**2023 Veteran's Day Prayer Service** Over the past four years, there has been a Veteran's Day prayer service at ALC the Sunday prior to Veteran's Day. All Veteran's, their families, as well as active duty service members and families are welcome to come to the Sanctuary for prayers of remembrance, safekeeping, and peace. Available near the Office are red ELW Prayerbooks for the Armed Services. This is a free gift to Veterans and active duty service members from the congregation.

**2023 Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany Series**, As we begin a new liturgical year with the first Sunday in Advent, we also begin a new sermon and worship series that will run from Advent through Epiphany. There will be numerous ways to take a deeper dive into this series to grow in your faith and cross-shaped spirituality. Look for a Advent Devotional Book and a Sunday Faith Forum focused on this year's theme: *How Does A Weary World Rejoice?* This theme comes to us from a group of writers and artists called "Sanctified Arts."

Items in short supply and high demand are children's coats sizes 2T to Junior's size 14. Snow boots and snow pants for students in grades K-8th are often requested.





## BECAUSE OF YOU...the GARAGE GANG gets things done!

Have you ever wondered how certain activities happen at ALC? Who comes up with the ideas – pastors, other staff, ministry teams? What's the behind-the-scene process?

Well, sometimes volunteers such as the "GARAGE GANG" generate ideas that turn into projects we all are fortunate to enjoy. You've never heard of the "Garage Gang?" You'll probably be surprised to know the gang consists of a group of women who started gathering in a heated garage in 2020 when COVID-19 prevented socializing the way they were accustomed. They were creative and found a fun way to be together in a safe place. This gang included Beve Vajgrt (owner of the heated



garage), Mary Brandt, Marchelle Jorgensen, Sheila Pederson and Connie Voss (plus a Catholic and a Presbyterian.)

Sometimes the group did book studies together, other times they played games or discussed community news, and sometimes they discussed creative ideas for ALC. One of their first projects occurred during the 2022 Lenten season. You probably remember the theme "Full to the Brim." These five women recruited the speakers for Wednesday Lenten services (John Nau, Paul Summers LaRoche, Dr. Mary Webbens, and Pat Henkels). They organized the Healing Bowl art project which included the repair of a broken ceramic bowl by bonding the broken pieces together with gold. The "Walk to Jerusalem" was their project, as well, as members of the congregation took part in the imaginary 80-mile walk from Capernaum to Jerusalem.

The Garage Gang launched the first Arts and Craft Fair in November of 2022. hey recruited craft items and baked goods from the congregation plus advertised in the community and area churches to creative a very impressive event in the Gathering Room and lobby area. The proceeds totaling \$4,600 were applied to ALC Building Debt.


Again, they are organizing the second Art Craft and Bake Sale coming up November 4 and 5 with proceeds going toward building debt. In addition to the sale of lovely holiday crafts, original artwork and other handmade items, there will be a bake sale, complimentary flavored coffee and a BBQ lunch. With their detailed planning, the sale will likely be another successful event!

Next on the Garage Gang's plate will be assisting with the Lenten 2024 season. Again, they will secure the Wednesday night speakers to enrich our time of worship together. We look forward to the season!

What a difference these five women have made in the life of our congregation during the last couple years! They have shared their imagination, their talents, their gift of organization and attention to detail for all our sakes. Because of you, Garage Gang, ...meaningful things get done!

**December Sunday Faith Forum Schedule,** \*\*\*The December Faith Forums will focus on growing a spirituality of awareness through scripture, art, and guided reflections. We will be using a prayer practice called "Visio Divina."

Visio Divina, latin for "divine seeing," is a method of meditation, reflection, and prayer through a process of intentional seeing. Visio Divina extends the 6th century Benedictine practice of Lectio Divina by the use of visual imagery. Traditionally, Visio Divina was accompanied by Benedictine iconography and illuminations, however, different faith traditions have adapted the process over time, utilizing both secular and nonsecular images. (Sanctified Arts writers).

There will be Faith Forums on December 3, 10, and 17.

**Tuesday Genesis to Revelation Adult Bible Study,** This whole Bible survey course continues on Tuesdays at 1:00pm. The class meets in the Conference Room where a Seminary Professor teaches a video lesson and then the group discusses the scripture readings and uplifted themes. Kris Besel is the instructor.
