care. We are privileged to meet and host our visitors in the Shetek Conference during their visit. They are beginning their visit in conferences in the northern part of the synod and will be with us as follows:

- 1. Members of the SW Synod Partnership Committee will be holding a welcome and potluck in Redwood Falls on September 26.
- 2. We will welcome three of the four delegates to Shetek Lutheran Ministries from October 2 4. There will be an open partnership potluck meal & meeting on Monday, October 2 starting at 5 PM. All are welcome & stay tuned for more details. The delegates will also visit Shalom Hill Farms while at Shetek along with other historical sites. Pastor Mike Stangeland who is the Dean of the Shetek Conference will host this visit.
- 3. We will be hosting Akhona from October 6-8. Plans are being developed to introduce Akhona to our communities and churches. We are tentatively planning on having Akhona at American Lutheran in Windom on Saturday, October 7 at their 5:30 Chapel Service. On Sunday, October 8, Akhona will be at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Lakefield at the 9 AM service and First Lutheran Worthington 9:30 service and American Lutheran in Worthington at the 10:15 am service. All are welcome to attend these services to meet and hear about the ministry in the SE Diocese of the Evangelical Church in Southeran Africa.
- 4. Agrippa will be visiting Bethlehem in Hills on Friday, October 6-Saturday, 7. Bethlehem at Hills has a connection to a circuit in SE Diocese and will be celebrating this partnership.

What an opportunity to learn from each other and grow in friendship and in faith in the one Lord Jesus Christ! The Shetek Conference Partnership Committee invites the members of the congregations of the Shetek Conference to pray for this important visit and take part as each are able.


