Have you noticed the shiny floor in the Fellowship Hall and the clean chair cushions? The floor has been described by some as shiny as the reflection off a lake! Please take a look if you haven't already done so.


Of course, those improvements didn't just happen on their own! They were organized by ALC's diligent Maintenance Committee and carried out by them and a few other willing volunteers the last week in July. The local



cleaning service Grothe Prosteam was contracted to do the work; but first in preparation, volunteers worked in-between worship services on Sunday, July 23rd to clear the hall. They folded up and moved all the tables into the hallway outside the kitchen and stacked up all 155 chairs there, as well.

The professional stripping and cleaning of the floor took place the next day on Monday, and two coats of waxing followed that same day. On Tuesday, the cleaners steam-cleaned the chair cushions and applied a protective coat of Scotch Guard. The blue metal-framed chairs in the new Conference Room were cleaned in the same manner. Later on Tuesday, members of the Maintenance Committee and a group of volunteers from the congregation brought all the tables and chairs back into the Fellowship Hall and arranged them without dragging or sliding, since the floor was still in the curing process.

THANK YOU to the Maintenance Committee (Members of the Maintenance Committee are David Baerenwald, Harlan Handevidt, Jay Jensen, Les Johnson, Bruce Juber, Dave Nerem, Arvid Nielsen, Craig Pfeifer and Lyle Voss) for taking charge of this project, to volunteers who helped out, and to the congregation whose offerings made the cleaning possible. **Because of you**, the Fellowship Hall is ready to welcome members, friends and family this fall! Now it's up to all of us to keep that sparkling floor as long as possible. Please lift up your chair when moving and avoid dragging tables and chairs. 
